A Call to Objective Thinking and Christian Voting By Reverend Anthony Coci

"They are mean, and they don't care about us; therefore, we need to vote this way and not their way." This is the common refrain we are going to hear as we get closer to the voting seasons this August and November. It is called an *ad hominem* (Latin: against the man) argument whereby one argues against another's position/platform because of something they perceive in the other's character. Today, many

are labeling those who support women and children (pro-lifers) as anti-women and anti-children because of something they perceive in their thought process. They mainly perceive pro-lifers as ignorant of science and women's health; as a result, passionate arguing and mudslinging ensues. Unfortunately, this approach does not bear any fruit, and I have a suspicion that this is how the devil is working to divide us. In this article I would like to invite us to put our labels aside and objectively think and pray through the issues at hand in a Christian manner.

We live in a democracy, which is a form of government controlled by the will of the people. Our form of democracy is a republic, whereby we elect representatives at the local, state, and federal levels who convey and carry out the will of the majority of people at those levels. What is a majority? This is the question that is currently up for debate. Presently in the State of Ohio the Ohio General Assembly has proposed an amendment to the Ohio Constitution to increase the threshold to amend the Ohio Constitution from a simple majority of 50% + 1 to a supermajority of 60%. In other words, currently Ohio requires a simple majority to make amendments to the Ohio Constitution. The **August 8 Special Election** is to increase it to 60%. An affirmative vote of **yes** would increase the threshold to 60%. Why does this matter? The Ohio Constitution is the supreme law of the state, and we need to make sure that any amendment to it represents a clear and stable majority of the people, and not simply a fad of the times. Another point to consider, the Constitution of the United States of America provides that an amendment may be proposed either by the Congress with a two-thirds majority vote in both the House of Representatives and the Senate or by a constitutional convention called by two-thirds of the state (38 of 50 States). With that said, I believe an increase of 10% points to the voting threshold is fair and prudent to determine the will of the majority in our democratic society. I encourage you to vote **Yes in August**.

On November 7 we have the opportunity to weigh in on the discussion of abortion in the state of Ohio. First, we must keep in mind the teaching of the Church, "Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion. This teaching has not changed and remains unchangeable. Direct abortion, that is to say, abortion willed either as an end or a means, is gravely contrary to the moral law," (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2271). Abortion is "gravely contrary to the moral law" because it is the taking of an innocent life; and we want to help women who have found themselves in seemingly impossible circumstances, or were manipulated into having an abortion, to seek healing and forgiveness in the Church. The question that often follows is: "What about rape and incest?" There are moral methods that a woman may participate in, that are not abortion or contraceptives that still follow the Church's teaching, that can prevent the sperm from fertilizing the egg. This is a deep conversation that goes beyond the scope of this article, but I mention it to let readers know there are ethical ways, that are in keeping with the Church's teachings, by which a woman can still protect herself and her body that do not violate the dignity of life. Second, we must be aware of who is pushing these laws in the State of Ohio. There are outside forces trying to write our laws. Third, the language of the proposed amendment is very extreme. It removes parental consent, eliminates the 24-hour waiting period, eliminates Down Syndrome Nondiscrimination Act, allows later term abortions on demand, allows chemical abortions on demand and over the counter purchases of drugs without a doctor involved, and eliminates health and safety standards for abortion clinics. In summary, this proposed amendment does not promote the common good for women or children. There are ethical ways to protect women but this ballot issue goes too far, and if this amendment passes there is no turning back. This issue is wrong and there are better ways that we can approach it. Let's go back to the drawing board. The Ohio Bishops urge all Catholics, as do I, to oppose this measure and vote No in November.

I urge all of you to pray and to put into action a love for women and children. We are called to be the salt of the earth (cf. Matthew 5:13) and to be a faithful remnant bringing the light of truth to the minds and hearts of our brothers and sisters. As we enter into this voting season, let us recall the story of Abraham interceding for Sodom that if God finds a small group of faithful people, He will spare the whole for the sake of the few (cf. Genesis 18:16-33). Let us walk the walk and truly accompany these women and children by providing them with resources, relationships, and real-life solutions that help them maintain their dignity. The Good News of life in Jesus Christ is meant for all. Let us pray that Ohio will remain truly a Christian state.


